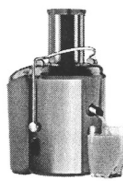

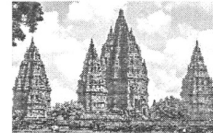

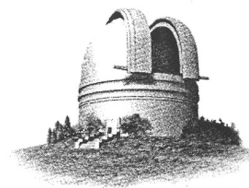

The Australian. The growing importance of Australia's relationship with China, our largest trading partner, has long been appreciated by this newspaper. Two-way trade with China increased by 16.5 percent last financial year to \$64 billion. More than 100,000 Chinese are studying in Australia and by 2005, a million Chinese tourists a year will be holidaying here.

The bilateral relationship is central to our national interest and holds the key to our future prosperity. Which is all the more reason why the government dealings with Chinese officials and business leaders must be open and transparent. The style of some of the Rudd government's dealings with China have not left that impression.

United States (December 8, 2012), the pharmacist of National Institute of Medical Services said that patients should get prescriptions refilled early enough so they won't run out of medicines. Running out could cause problems with his medicine schedules. The pharmacist also reminded them checking expiration dates frequently and discard any medicines that out-of-date.

Some medication must be stored in the proper place. Keeping a check list of all the prescription and over-the-counter medications are very important. For each medicine, the doctor told the patients to mark the amount they take, the time of day they take the medicine, and the medicine should be taken with food.

Another important thing is that patients must review their medicine record to the doctor whenever their doctor prescribes new medicine. Their doctor may have new information about their medicines that might be important to them. The doctor also said that their patients should have their health care provider write down advice and instruction for taking the medication.

Finally, the doctor insisted that the pharmacist be a good source of information about the patients' medications. In addition, the pharmacist keeps records of all the prescriptions the patients get filled at the drug store. The pharmacist always helps them select non-prescription medications. (NEWS: HEALTH)

Walter Elias Disney (December 5, 1901–December 15, 1966) was an American animated film producer and animator. He was also the creator of an American-based theme park called Disneyland, and the founder of the highly profitable corporation, now known as The Walt Disney Company.

Disney was born in Chicago to Elias Disney and Flora Call. He was named after his father and after his father's close friend Walter Parr, the minister at St. Paul Congregational Church. In 1906, his family moved to a farm near Marceline, Missouri. The family sold the farm in 1909 and lived in a rented house until 1910, when they moved to Kansas City. Disney was nine years old.

According to the Kansas City, Missouri, Public School District records, Disney began attending the Benton Grammar School in 1911, and continued his formal education there until he graduated on June 8, 1917. During this time, Disney also enrolled in classes at the Kansas City Art Institute. In the fall of 1917, Disney rejoined his family. He left school at the age sixteen and became a volunteer ambulance driver in World War I, after he changed his birth certificate to show his year of birth as 1900 in order to be able to enlist in the service. He served as a member of the American Red Cross Ambulance Force in France till 1919.

A flood is an overflow of an expanse of water that submerges land. In the sense of “flowing water”, the word may also be applied to inflow of the tide. Flooding may result from the volume of water within a body of water, such as a river or lake, which overflows or break levees, with the result that some of the water escapes its unusual boundaries.

While the size of a lake or other body of water will vary with seasonal changes in precipitation and snow melt, it is not a significant flood unless such escapes of water endanger land areas used by man like a village, city or other inhabited area.

Floods can also occur in rivers, when flow exceeds the capacity of the river channel, particularly at bends or meanders. Flood often cause damage to homes and businesses if they are placed in natural flood plains of rivers. While flood damage can be virtually eliminated by moving away from rivers and other bodies of water, since time out of mind, people have lived and worked by the water to seek the sustenance and capitalize on the gains of cheap and easy travel and commerce by being near water. That humans continue to inhabit areas threatened by flood damage is evidence that the perceived value of living near the water exceeds the cost of repeated periodic flooding.

Affleck not only handled the lead role but also directed *Argo*, and in doing so solidified his place as one of the best directors of his generation.

Blueberries, cranberries, and huckleberries and related plants have now been found to contain resveratrol, a potential anti-cancer agent, according to Agricultural Research Service (ARS) scientists who made the discovery. This new finding from ARS adds to previous research by other scientists who found that dark-skinned bunch grapes contain resveratrol.

Using chemical identification procedures, the team of scientists measured the resveratrol content of 30 whole fruit samples of blueberry, cranberry, huckleberry and related plants. The samples represented five families and 10 species of *Vaccinium* fruit. They also measured resveratrol in skin, juice/pulp and seed samples of muscadine grape. Because of its important biological properties, resveratrol has been examined extensively in grapes. Studies showed the compound protects the grapes from fungal diseases. It also provides health benefits for consumers by reducing the risk of cardiovascular disease. The compound's anticancer potential warranted its examination in other fruits.

The team's studies showed that several fruits samples of *Vaccinium* contain varying amounts of the compound. Analysis of the extracts of the skin, juice/pulp and seed of muscadine grapes showed that concentration of resveratrol more *Vaccinium* and muscadine samples is continuing. The new data could help build a foundation for increasing resveratrol in those berry and grape crops that are important to many small farmers. Future research goals will include enhancing production of resveratrol in selected species.
