“The coral reefs are gorgeous!” screamed Yovita Ayu Liwanuru, Miss Scuba Indonesia 2012, as she emerged on the water’s surface after diving around Owi Island in the Padaido Archipelago, Biak Numfor regency, Papua.

“They’re teeming with fish, especially lionfish,” added the woman, with a broad smile of satisfaction at the end of two dives after previous day’s diving off Rurbas Island.

The two islands belong to the island group of Padaido, which is located in the eastern part of Biak Island and can be reached within two hours by speedboat from the port of Biak.

Padaido comprises 30 islets in Cendrawasih Bay, 17 of which are uninhabited. With its pristine water, wide sandy beaches and high biodiversity, the place is ideal for marine adventures such as diving, snorkeling and swimming.

There are at least 12 dive spots in Padaido but it is likely that many more new dive locations will be discovered, as not all the potential areas in this zone have been explored.

With its untouched coral reefs, which offer a great variety of marine life as well as visibility of up to 30 meters, who can resist the area’s underwater charms? The formation of rain depends upon several interesting processes of nature. Moisture is constantly being taken up from the earth's surface, especially from the warmer parts of the ocean. The process where by this moisture is picked up is called evaporation. The moisture, called water vapour, cannot be seen. It is mixed with the other gases in the air and is carried upward by the wind.

The moisture loaded air cools as it rises. This is because the air expands as it rises. Once the air starts to rise it will continue to do so until its temperature is the same as that of the air surrounding it. When the temperature is equalized, the upward movements of that mass of air is halted.

As air rises and cools, the amount of water vapour it can hold decreases. If the rising and cooling continues long enough the air will become saturated. If the air is then cooled below that point, it is said to have reached the dew point. When air reaches the dew point, some of the water vapour the air contains condenses into tiny particles of water, so fine that they might be called water dust. This water dust is known as clouds or fog, according to whether it is high in the air or near the surface of the earth. A still greater cooling of the air will cause tiny cloud particles to unite into drops so large and heavy that they fall

Light Fly, Fly High

Being born at the bottom of the social ladder is often a death sentence for the dreams of those who wish for upward social mobility.

This is especially true for “untouchable” young Dalit women like Thulasi in India. Born outside of the caste system, women like her to have their lives pre-determined. They are expected to get married whenever their parents tell them to and to accept their place at the bottom of society.

Thulasi, however, is different. She doesn’t want to give in to her fate. She is literally willing to fight her way to a better life. She enters the boxing ring and uses fighting to open a path to independence.

But despite her impressive record in the ring, ranking third in India’s Light Fly category, she still finds herself at the bottom, held back by her male superiors, one of whom demands money and sex in exchange for “favors”. Thulasi, steadfast as ever, refuses to compromise her dignity.

Light Fly, Fly High follows Thulasi in her uphill battle for success. It is a gripping and inspiring Norwegian documentary about a courageous young woman who refuses to be anyone’s victim and ends up becoming a hero despite the odds stacked against her.

The film was the winner of the Oxfam Global Justice Award at the International Documentary Film Festival Amsterdam. It was an official selection at the International Film Festival and Forum on Human Rights in Geneva as well as on International Women’s Day at the United Nations in Brussels.

The movie’s last screening is today at 4:30 p.m. at the Instituto Italiano di Cultura.

HOUSE HUSBANDS' HEART RISK

Most people assume that life in the rat race is bad for your health. But reversing the traditional gender roles, being a house husband is a stressful business, according to the latest research by American scientists. By giving up their jobs in order to become house husbands, men increase their risk of heart attack or coronary disease by as much as 82%, according to research based on 10 year study of 2.500 people in Boston, USA.

According to Dr Elaine Eaker, the key to the problem is that some men became stressed about performing a role not traditionally assign to them by society. Men who stay at home tend not to have the same levels of support from friends and family as women do the same.

Jack O'Sullivan, of the Father's Direct group, was quoted as saying: "Society expects the main career should be a woman and society is structured around that. Day care is called *mother and toddler groups* and some men feel awkward about belonging to those groups.

Professor Gary Cooper, a psychologist at the University of Manchester, said many men tend to underestimate the task of caring for a family. He said 'Most men think being a house husband involves putting on a bit of washing, taking the kids to school and then putting their feet up with a cup of coffee.

They are crazy. Most men are not used to performing a variety of activities simultaneously – the kind of multi-tasking which is second nature to most women.'

It is estimated that men have taken over the main homemaker's role in one in seven homes, as increasing numbers of women become the main breadwinner. The study also found that women in high-powered jobs were more likely to develop heart disease than those in more junior positions.
